

Chances are, your Mac can run macOS Sierra.

Mac computers introduced in late 2009 or later can be upgraded to macOS Sierra.

Check your Mac hardware ⊙



Make sure you're ready to upgrade.

Before you upgrade, we recommend that you back up your Mac. You should also have your Apple ID and password handy. Then, if your Mac is running OS X Lion 10.7.5 or later, you can upgrade directly to macOS Sierra.

Copy images, video, and text from an app on your iPhone, then paste into another app on your Mac — or vice versa.




You've got the most powerful iOS ever on your iPhone. Here are some of the amazing new things you can do with it.

Messages

New Apple Software



Make your messages stand out with bubble effects. In the Messages app, type your message or insert a photo, then touch and hold 1. Tap 1 to preview the bubble effect you'd like to use. Then tap 1 to send.





Reply to texts quicker with Tapback. When you receive a text message, just double-tap the message to select one of six quick responses. You can like messages, dislike them, love them, and more.





Put a sticker on it. In Messages, tap (A), then tap (B) to access the App Store for iMessage and download a sticker pack. Tap a sticker to send it like a photo. Or touch and hold a sticker to drag it over texts, photos, or other stickers.



Send money with Siri. Siri now works with your favorite apps.
Which means you can do things like send money by saying, "Hey Siri, Venmo Ryan Carbonetti \$40 for tickets." Use Siri for messaging, photo searches, ride booking — you name it.






Search photos by mountains, flowers, animals, and more. In the Photos app, tap the search icon. Then type exactly what you're looking for. You can search for all kinds of scenes and objects, like beaches, cars, dogs, and much more.





Book a ride in Maps. Type in a destination and then tap the Directions button. Next, tap the Ride icon in the lower-right corner. You'll see car options, wait times, and pricing from ride-booking apps you've already downloaded, like Uber and Lyft.

Respond to notifications from the Lock screen. Using 3D Touch, press a little harder on your messages to respond without having to leave your notifications. You can also use 3D Touch to reply to Calendar invitations?



Swipe for faster access to what you use most. Pick up your iPhone to wake it,3 then swipe left to bring up your camera. Swipe right for the Today view. Swipe down from the top to see notifications. Or swipe up from the bottom to access the enhanced Control Center.




